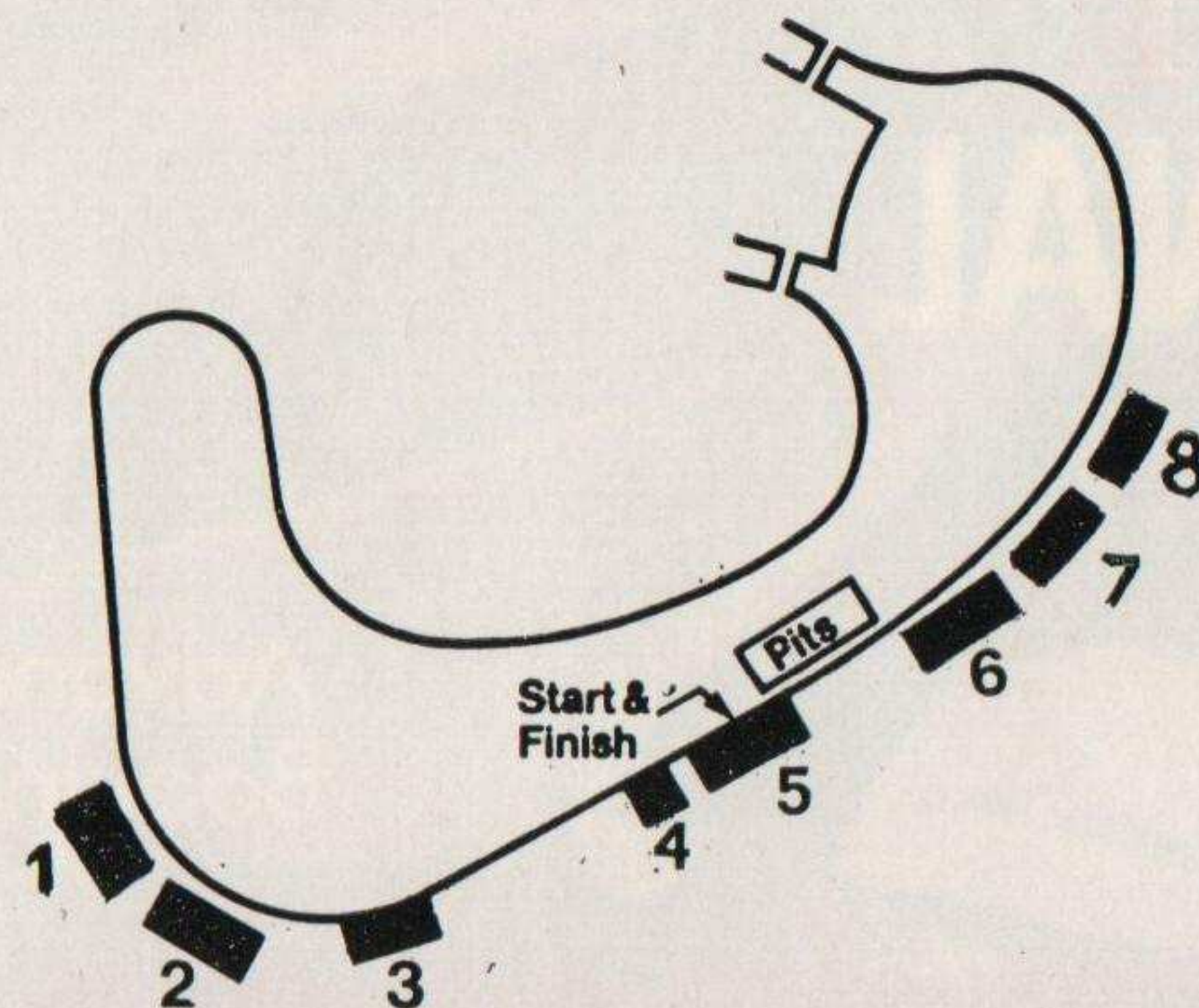
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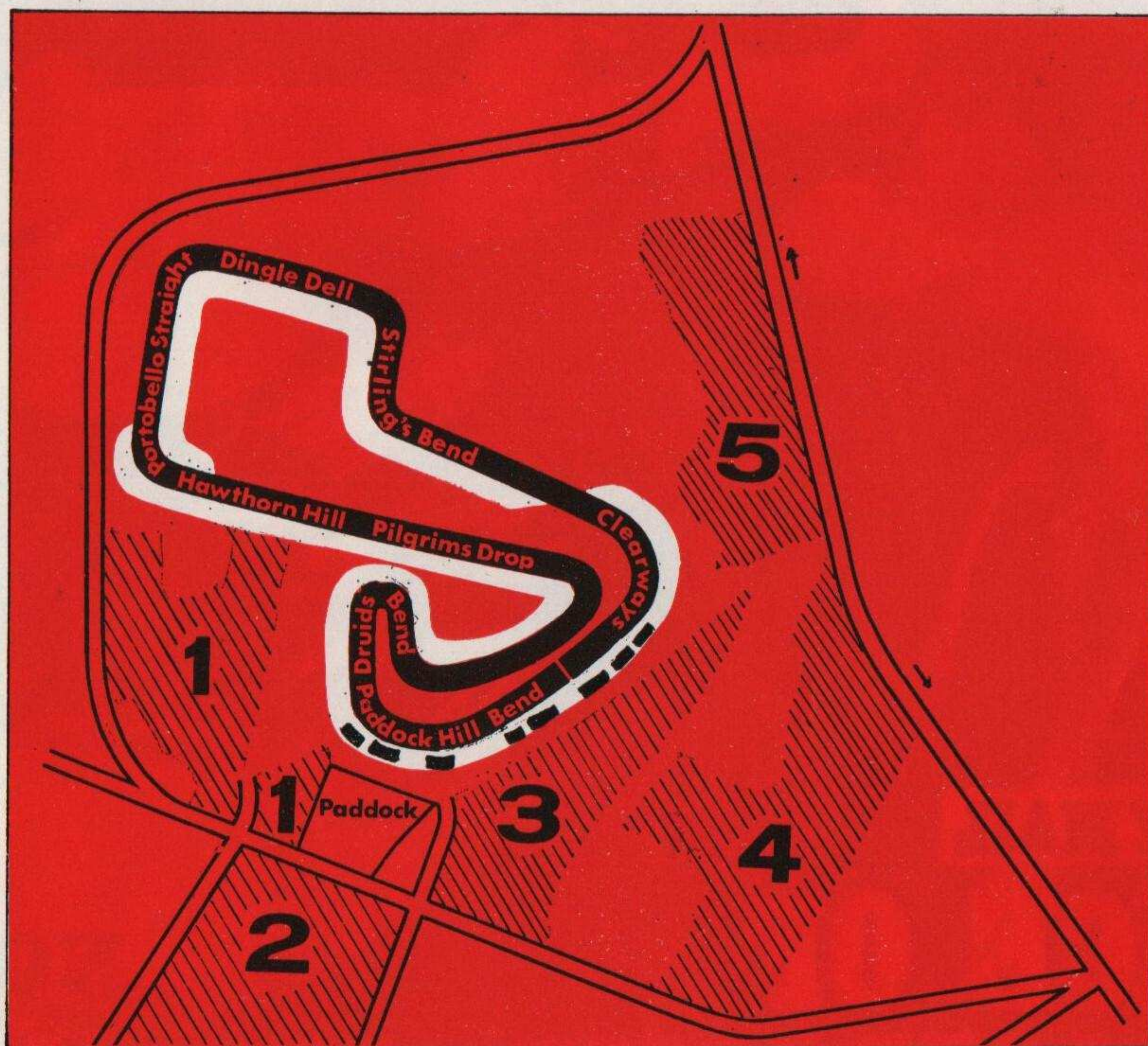

## DON'T MISS CHAMPIONS' DAY

Established stars and coming men . . . new cars on the brink of the 1971 Grand Prix series in Europe . . . a host of new faces in the cockpits . . . That is the exciting pattern for the BRSCC's great DAILY MAIL RACE OF CHAMPIONS which takes place on Sunday, March 21, on the famous 2.65 miles Grand Prix circuit at Brands Hatch.

This offers you your first chance of seeing the very latest Formula 1 machinery in action, only a month before these cars battle at Barcelona in the Spanish Grand Prix. It will be motor racing history in the making as all the famous manufacturers turn out with their 'secret weapons' before the world championship series gets under way in earnest. Success at Brands Hatch could well be a significant pointer to the whole season. So everyone will be really trying.

The list of makes invited to take part promises to be a complete Who's Who of top-league motor racing . . .

BRABHAM . . . BRM . . . FERRARI . . . LOTUS . . . MARCH . . . MATRA . . . McLAREN . . . SURTEES . . . TYRELL . . . plus the possibility of some F1 newcomers as well.

A really splendid field of the world's most thrilling machinery being pressed to the limit as team managers and drivers test out the competition in preparation for what promises to be one of motor racing's most hard-fought seasons.

As ever, there will of course be world champions in this modern classic . . . GRAHAM HILL . . . DENNY HULME . . . JACKIE STEWART . . . JOHN SURTEES. But this top quartet are bound to be under tremendous pressure from the many up-and-coming drivers anxious to make their mark.

Indeed, the DAILY MAIL RACE OF CHAMPIONS promises more new faces than British racegoers have ever seen in a Formula 1 event. March 21 could give you your first opportunity of seeing brilliant Brazilian EMERSON FITTIPALDI, winner of the United States Grand Prix, at the wheel of the 1971 version of the fabulous Lotus 72. Your first chance, too, of watching REINE WISELL, the Swedish star and already a Brands Hatch favourite, showing his prowess in a Grand Prix Lotus on the Kent circuit. Throw in such names as RONNIE PETERSON, FRANCOIS CEVERT and TIM SCHENKEN and there's a real wealth of young talent.

Then there's JACKY ICKX, who won three GPs last season with that very potent Ferrari 312B, and his teammate CLAY REGAZZONI, the biggest surprise of the 1970 season, who picked up a victory and three second places in the last five GPs of the year. Add in drivers like JEAN-PIERRE BELTOISE, CHRIS AMON, HENRI PESCAROLO, RALPH STOMMELEN and PETER GETHIN and the line-up is formidable. And there'll probably be more when the entries are finalised.

There's no doubt this will be a very fast race. That lap record of 1 minute 25.8 seconds, 111.19 miles an hour, set by Jack Brabham in last year's thrilling DAILY MAIL RACE OF CHAMPIONS, should be ripe for cracking. It also looks certain that the race average will top 110 miles an hour for the first time.

So this year's DAILY MAIL RACE OF CHAMPIONS should definitely be a spine-tingling event. There will be champions galore on the track, and the race is supported – for the third year – by the CHAMPION SPARKING PLUG COMPANY.

But the day offers even more than that. There is also a tremendous two-part SKF Trophy Race for saloons, a qualifying round in the hotly contested British Saloon Car Championship. And a close-fought Townsend Thoresen Formula Ford Trophy Race with all the latest FF machinery on show.

Practice, too, will be enlivened by the now traditional battle for 100 bottles of champagne, presented by the EVENING NEWS for the fastest Formula 1 time recorded during the two sessions on the morning of Friday, March 19.

And on SATURDAY, MARCH 20, a very busy practice day will be spiced with a fully subscribed Formula 3 event – the SHELL SUPER OIL TROPHY RACE. This 40-lapper is a qualifying round for the £40,000 Shell Super Oil British F3 Championship, and is certainly a race no enthusiast will want to miss, with all the F3 top-rankers in their new 1,600 cc machinery.
