





Formula 5000 has never been more open

Bearing in mind that because of printing schedules, this has to be written before the Silverstone race on Saturday, April 6, this is no time to stick out your neck and forecast a winner for this afternoon's Rothmans 5000 European Championship race. Just as last year, when the season was about half way through before anyone had won two Formula 5000 races, so the 1974 season has begun with a different winner in every race and the formula has never been more open than it is today.

We have Peter Gethin in the works-backed Chevron Racing Team VDS entry, fresh from his triumph in the Tasman Championship. There is his team-mate, the Belgian Teddy Pilette who is the reigning Rothmans champion who began to amass his point last year by a series of high placings and then confirmed his ability by joining the band of race

There is David Hobbs, in the Hogan Racing Lola, who won at Silverstone last spring (in what was, at that moment, the very fastest race ever held on that high speed track) but then went away to spend the rest of the season racing in a similar series in North America, with Brian Redman as one of his leading rivals. There is Redman himself in Sid Taylor's Lola, which is about as fast a combination as you can imagine, particularly in

view of Brian's past record of wins here, and the Australian Vern Schuppan in Sid's other car, a Trojan.

Going back to Hobbs, for a moment, he demonstrated that he is as quick as ever by a fine win at Mallory Park in March, although the challenge was greatly reduced by a first-corner shunt which sadly reduced the field. Then, as a week previously, when Gethin won the Rothmans championship race here, it was a newcomer to F5000, Mike Wilds in the Dempster Developments March, who was runner-up and, at the time of writing, Mike leads the points table in the Rothmans championship.

There is 1973 "BP Superman" Bob Evans in Alan McKechnie's new Lola (another of last year's race winners) and Ian Ashley, now going very rapidly in the ShellSPORT Luxembourg Lola and winner of the non-championship Formula 5000 race in the Brands Hatch "Race of Champions", after the retirement of Tony Dean's Chevron, which is another car with a fine chance, Dean being the runner-up to Pilette in last year's championship. Ashley's team-mate, the "Tigress of Turin" Lella Lombardi, is going better with every race, as she becomes more accustomed to all those 500 horses pushing away behind her, and she is thoroughly justifying her place in F5000 by sheer ability and not just as the only girl driver in major single-seater racing.

And let's not overlook Keith Holland, Guy Edwards and Steve Thompson, all winners in 1973 5000 races, nor the smiling Dane Tom Belso who helped the ShellSPORT Luxembourg team to the entrant's championship in last year's Rothmans series.

Rothmans 5000 European Championship

This year's Rothmans 5000 European Championship—the sixth sponsored by Rothmans of Pall Mall—is a 23-race series offering about £200,000 to competitors.

Prize money is allocated by Rothmans and race organisers at £7,040 or £3,720 per race according to distance and championship awards at the season's end account for another £6,000.

Travel expenses total around £47,000 for the nine rounds on the Continent and in Ireland and at least £31,500 in success bonuses is offered by Firestone, Goodyear, Ireland and at least £315,000 in success bonuses is offered by Firestone, Goodyear, Ford, Champion and Lockheed.

Championship points are awarded at the rate of 20-15-12-10-8-6-4-3-2-1 for the first ten places, with double points scored at the final round at Brands Hatch on October 20.

British rounds for the championship are at Brands Hatch, Mallory Park, Oulton Park, Snetterton, Silverstone and Thruxton and the foreign races are at Mondello Park (Ireland) Monza, Misano, Imola, Casale and Mugello (all in Italy) Zolder (Belgium), Jyllandsringen (Denmark) and Zandvoort (Holland). A non-championship race is scheduled for Estoril (Portugal) in November.

Today's is the fifth round of the championship, and the second to be staged at Brands Hatch—although the opening round, which was staged during the Simoniz-Daily Mail Race of Champions, was run on the Grand Prix circuit.




