In the setting of Great Britain's most attractive motor racing circuit, the 29th Tourist Trophy Race of the Royal Automobile Club promises to be a more exciting spectacle than ever before in the long history of this event, which goes back nearly 60 years, almost to the beginning of this great sport.

This, the seventh T.T. race to be held at Goodwood, brings together both the most rapid grand touring cars in existence (the sort of luxury two-seaters you could buy for a long Continental holiday—if you could afford them!) and the latest sports racing cars, undoubtedly the fastest road-racing vehicles ever made.

The lengthy series of Ferrari wins at Goodwood is to be even more hotly challenged than in the past, for applications for entries have been made from the U.S.A., the home of the vast V8 engine, as well as from Europe and the Commonwealth. The task of the challengers is not easy, as the Ferrari cars have already proved this season their stamina as well as their speed in the long distance races at Le Mans and Rheims. But at Goodwood the story could well be different, since on 29th August all types of sports racing cars will be permitted (some of the very fastest were inadmissible at the two great French races) and the


legendary Lotus Thirty, powered by a huge Ford V8 engine, Coopers with other, even bigger, V8 units from various manufacturers, and yet further exciting makes, will be driven by the top drivers of the world in a battle-royal of these streamlined, four-wheeled projectiles.

Private testing of some of these cars at Goodwood indicates that they will handsomely exceed the lap speeds achieved by the latest Formula 1 machines and that these sports racing cars are some of the most spectacular machines ever put on wheels.

Even so, there are many who will expect the first car to complete the 500 kilometres distance to be a grand touring car, because of the greater reliability of these production-type models of deceptively impressive performance, and because they may spend less time stationary at the pits.

Starting at mid-day, there is a supporting race of smaller grand touring cars in which the competition is likely to be just as hot as in the T.T. itself.

HOW TO GET THERE

The Goodwood Motor Circuit is situated some two miles north-east of Chichester, Sussex, and is reached through East Lavant from the Guildford—Midhurst—Chichester road, A286, or alternatively through Chiddingfold and Petworth, on A283 and A285. B2141 connects with Petersfield in a north-westerly direction, while the Southampton—Fareham—Arundel—Brighton coast road, A27, gives access from the west and east. Goodwood is roughly 60 miles from London, 85 from Oxford, 90 from Bath, and 120 from Cambridge.


